

**2015 Grow Detroit's Young Talent Program:
Results from Youth Exit Surveys**

Introduction

The state of Michigan and the nation seem to be recovering following the devastating consequences of the Great Recession, but the City of Detroit, and youth in particular, continue to need robust support. While both the state and national unemployment rates have hovered right at 5% during the latter part of 2015¹, the estimated rate for Detroit was more than double that in October of 2015 at 13%². The national unemployment rate was also high among youth aged 16 to 24 in July of 2015, at 12.2% overall and 20.7% for African Americans³. These statistics are likely even higher for youth living in Detroit.

As the labor market becomes more uncertain, getting job experience early is increasingly important. Since its start in 2009 the Detroit Youth Employment Consortium (DYEC) has been committed to expanding summer and year-round employment opportunities for resident youth ages 14-24. The DYEC created the Grow Detroit's Young Talent (GDYT) program and campaign to expand access to work experiences for Detroit youth and, over the past seven years, has provided work readiness training and a subsidized work experience to thousands of young people through its partner organizations. As the DYEC continues to expand pipelines for the future workforce, gathering timely data helps to maintain quality programming and provide feedback from youth participants. The data offered in this report can contribute to the Consortium's work as well as broader conversations about employment and workforce opportunities for young people in the area.

The information on the following pages reflects another year of programming through Grow Detroit's Young Talent. The opinions and responses of 288 participants in the summer of 2015 were collected from youth responding to an on-line survey link shared by their worksite as well as additional outreach to My Brother's Keeper participants and individuals in more intensive job placements. The number of responses was much less than expected given that the request was not sent through the on-line portal as anticipated. However, trends in previous reports appear to be consistent with the responses this year.

Questions focused on whether GDYT participation increased or decreased skills, interests, and self-assessments in a variety of areas. These areas include job skills, employment readiness, academic skills, and academic preparedness.

Participants continue to indicate they understand important job skills such as working as a team, and communicating with others, either more or much more now

following GDYT. As in the past, there was less indication that participants understand academic skills, such as reading and writing, more following participation, although practically no one suggested they understood them less.

Similar to past results, a significant majority of respondents felt that GDYT participation helped them understand what kind of jobs they like and the qualifications that they might need for their desired career. In addition, most respondents report now thinking they can get a better job, thinking they can reach a higher level of education, having more confidence, planning to do community service, and thinking they can be a leader. As in the past, a significant majority of respondents say that they expect to attend a 4-year college or a graduate or professional school.


In response to a request by the DYEC, we asked participants whether they expected to be living in Michigan by age 25. Almost 60% of participants responded yes or probably yes. This year, we also included an open-ended follow up question asking youth to explain their answer. The responses are fascinating and range from wanting to stay near family, be responsive to opportunities, move to other locations with better weather, and linking to where they attend college. The verbatim text submitted by participants are included at the end of the document. We also include open-ended responses to three other queries: job skills the young people wanted to learn, but didn't, suggestions for making GDYT better, and career goals for 10 years from now.

The most common response to skills they would like to learn was more about working with computers and money management/how to file taxes. Learning more about IT/Computers was also a frequent response in 2013 when this question was first asked. The most common response to suggestions for making GDYT better was better organization and items regarding money or getting pay cards on time. This is also similar to past findings.


The demographic breakdown of respondents is as follows: 59% female, 77% African American, 74% were between the ages of 15 and 18. In addition, 46% said they had worked for GDYT before. Results below are presented in percentages, except where otherwise noted.
