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Learning Acquisition Methods

20% of development occurs through peer learning and from observing and working with mentors, coaches, and instructors. 10% of development occurs through formal learning like classes, eLearning, or books

70% of development occurs through doing and actual experiences, completion of tasks and problem solving.



What is Field Education?

Field education (field placement, practicum, experiential education) is the applied learning, real-world training portion of the MSW curriculum.

- Field consists of SW 515 (Foundation Field Course) & SW 691 (Advanced Field Course)
- Every student will spend 16-24 hours per week in field during the semesters of your field courses
- 14 field course credits for 16 mo, 20 mo and MasterTrack students = 912 hours over 3 terms in field (4 terms for students in the part-time program)
- 12 field course credits for advanced standing students = 684 hours over 3 terms in field

Be prepared for this time commitment



Why is Field Important?

- It requires you to commit and practice the core values of the social work profession
- It prepares you to become the provider of service to the clients and community you will be serving
- It allows you to engage in critical thinking and self-reflection
- It encourages you to understand the use of self in relation to your impact on others
- It allows you to begin to create your own professional identity and career goals

Everything you do in field is a learning opportunity.



What Will I Do In Field?

Develop CSWE Social Work Competencies and Skills

Practice and apply classroom theories and concepts in a real-world setting Practice navigating ethical concerns according to the NASW Code of Ethics

Where will my Field Placement be?



MSW candidate

- "Local" options in SE Michigan and Northern Ohio, most in Ann Arbor and Detroit
- <u>Most</u> students travel an average of 30 to 60 minutes to get to field
- Spring/Summer term national and international field placement options





Transportation

- You are responsible for your transportation to your field site
- If you don't drive or have a car, indicate this on your application, as this does limit options
- Transportation options can include carpooling and public transportation





Employment Based Placements (EBP)

- Some may wish to explore whether your current employment can also serve as your field placement
- There are multiple requirements and a separate application required
- Major requirements include: (full details are available in the EBP application)
 - your proposed employment based placement can meet your planned pathway and CSWE competencies
 - your agency is willing to pursue the approval process
 - your agency is willing to support the number of field hours required
 - your agency has a MSW on staff who meets current field instructor requirements
- The Employment based placements process begins with the same process of applying via the field application



Entering Your Field Placement

Entering field means you are entering a new community.

Field sites and field instructors understand you're a student there to learn.

However, as a professional graduate social work student you are expected to have skills and attributes in the following areas per our <u>UM-SSW Technical Standards</u>

- Communication
- Intellectual and Cognitive Skills
- Emotional and Behavioral Readiness



Best Approaches to Field: 5 Pieces of Advice

- Own your learning and manage your expectations
- Learn to function with discomfort, anxiety, and ambiguity
- Be willing to make mistakes
- Be patient with all you have to learn
- Want, seek and use feedback

- Training program cycle
- Changes in funding
- Previous experience with students

Student

- Program schedule
- Student availability
- Student's interest/pathway
- Related experience
- Professional presentation

Composing and Submitting Your Field Application

The Field Application will ask you to identify your priorities and select placement options. Every effort will be made to match you with a selected or similar agency that aligns with your pathway and goals. Please note this is a dynamic and constantly shifting process.

Goal statement: 1-2 page written statement that we share with potential field placements to give them an idea of your knowledge, skills and interests

- Follow the <u>goal statement guidelines</u> to compose
- Feel free to reach out to the SSW Writing Skills/Study Skills coordinator: <u>SSW Writing</u> <u>Assistance</u>

Resume: Same as any other resume, but with any social work experience or skills emphasized

- Please ensure you use your UMich email address on your resume! This is how agencies/field instructors will contact you.
- The Office of Career Services (CSO) website has <u>resume guidelines and examples</u>



Composing and Submitting Your Field Application Resources

- Need resume help? You are invited to submit your resume and/or goal statement to the Office of Career Services at (<u>ssw-cso@umich.edu</u>). They request you submit materials for review two weeks or more prior to the field application deadline. More notice is preferred.

Placement then Finalized or Field Faculty to Identify Next Opportunity



What if I Don't Get an Interview or Am Not Accepted After I Interview?

- Don't worry and reach out to your field faculty to discuss your situation and circumstances
- Your assigned field faculty can provide any feedback received and offer support to improve your interview skills
- You may need to reflect on where you are in your skill development and what placements might be a better fit at this time
- Field faculty work as a team. We will work together to find the next opportunity for you.
- Students who are unsuccessful after two interview attempts will meet with their placing Field Faculty and the Field Director (or Assistant Director).



Preparing to Start Field

Congratulations on your placement!

- Review the content on the <u>Prepare to Start website</u>
- Read: <u>Are You a Joy?</u>
- Check in with the field instructor before the start date about any additional requirements you'll need to complete *Examples*
 - Health screenings & drug testing
 - Background checks
 - HR application
- Make sure you are checking and responding to emails from your umich account throughout the summer to ensure timely communication
- Attend pre-field orientation during SEED Week
- READ the syllabus and review your assigned Field Canvas site

Types of Hospital Placements:



Medical / Psychiatry

Inpatient / Ambulatory (Outpatient)

Maco Placements-some IP "light"





Hours and Credits:

Many hospitals require additional field hours = 24 hours per week every semester

Often includes a student program as part of those hours

May need to use some elective credits





Hospital Requirements

Many hospital placement require proof of immunizations and in some cases titers

Some hospital placements require a current drug screen

BLS-Basic Life Saving Course is required for some placements

Interview Process:

Each hospital holds interviews in unique formats

Some quite specific process with little flexibility in timing or location

Class Requirement:

SW 714 an Interprofessional Education course is a required class for all students in hospital and health care based placements and is only offered in the Winter semester





Medical Placements Provide:

- Clinical experience in a variety of settings (clinical is not only therapy)
- Experience in working as part of an interdisciplinary team
- Opportunity to work with various patient populations
- Potential for exposure to experiences in high acuity intensive care, crisis emergency care, chronic health care, specialty care, primary care, etc.
- Ability to engage in social work opportunities in micro, mezzo and macro levels

Larger Health Systems: Children's Hospital of Michigan, Henry Ford Health System, Michigan Medicine, Trinity Health System, VA Medical Center

- Assessment
- Intervention
- Advocacy
- Evaluation

Abilities:

- Independent
- Flexible
- Efficient in a fast-paced environment
- Organized



Course Requirements

- Interpersonal Practice or Welfare of Children and Families Pathway *
- SW 626 School Social Work Assessments
- SW 628 School Social Work Interventions
- SW515/SW691: 500 Field Hours of direct service with children and youth.

*Exceptions can be made for students in the Community Change pathway and the Global pathway, if the field placement can accommodate 500 hours of direct practice with children and youth, and a meeting is held with Beth Sherman to formulate a specific plan.



Approval Process

- State of Michigan School Social Worker Approval Process:
 - Form 310 Recommendation for Temporary Approval Request Form
- Other States' Requirements: Each state has its own requirements for school social workers, please check your state's department of education website for details.
