The Purpose of MSW Field Education

- Field education (field placement, practicum, experiential education) is the applied learning, real-world training portion of the MSW curriculum.
- It is **NOT** intended to be your first career experience meaning
 - This means that students may be placed in settings that do not align with their career interests
 - The focus is to develop transferable skills and competencies
- Field education provides the opportunity to take classroom learning and practice these concepts and skills in the community where social work takes place
- It's crucial to preserve your placement and work to address resolvable challenges; disruptions can result in <u>significant</u> costs and delay graduation



What Will I Do In Field?

Develop CSWE Social Work Competencies and Skills

Practice and apply classroom theories and concepts in a real-world setting Practice navigating ethical concerns according to the NASW Code of Ethics

Practice skills and behaviors that lead to core competency development Practice and ensure adherence to our <u>Technical</u> <u>Standards</u>

Intellectual & Cognitive Skills

Emotional & Behavioral Readiness









Field Time Commitment

2, 3, or 4 semesters depending on your curriculum plan - please refer to your Course Planning Sheet



Please plan accordingly. Field is typically during normal business hours Mon-Fri 8a-5p



Common Field Questions

Is Field a Class?

• Yes. You will need to register for 515 or 691 each semester

Can I complete my field placement at my place of employment?

• Yes! As long as your employer approves, you have a qualified MSW field instructor, and your job allows you to practice the social work competencies required for your pathway

Can I change field placements?

• Field placements are only changed in extenuating situations. This will result in delaying your progress through the program which may include delaying graduation and result in additional tuition costs

Do I have to find my own placement?

• No, on campus and local online students will select from our list of available placements.

Can I do my placement at two different locations?

No. Students are placed with one agency at a time



Common Field Questions

Are practicum placements paid?

• Some. U of M allows agencies to pay interns, but it is uncommon

Can I have an evenings and weekends only field placement?

- Evening and weekend field placement opportunities are very limited and, if requested, may restrict student placement options.
- Every effort will be made to find an appropriate placement at an eligible field site during evening and weekend hours, if available.
- Please prepare to be in a field placement within normal business hours (Mon-Fri 8-5p)

I am working full time - how will I fit my field placement in with classes?

• You will need to adjust your work schedule to prepare to complete field within normal business hours

I am only interested in a psychotherapy placement. What options do I have?

- We are limited by the number of agencies accepting students that we have legal contracts with. No one graduates ready to independently see psychotherapy clients.
- The goal is to ensure you obtain field hours that align with accreditation requirements for your MSW degree

Have Your Goal Statement and Resume Ready

Goal statement: 1-2 page written statement that is shared with potential field placements to give them an idea of your knowledge, skills and interests

- Follow the <u>goal statement guidelines</u> to compose
- Feel free to reach out to the SSW Writing Skills/Study Skills coordinator: <u>SSW Writing</u> <u>Assistance</u>

<u>Resume</u>: Same as any other resume, but with any social work experience or skills emphasized

- Please ensure you use your UMich email address on your resume. This is how agencies/field instructors will contact you.
- The Office of Career Services (CSO) website has resume guidelines and examples



Composing and Submitting Your Field Application

The online field application will require you to confirm you have:

- Attended or watched this Introduction to Field Education Webinar
- Reviewed the Incoming Field Students Website
- Prepared your goal statement according to requirements listed in the Goal Statement Guidelines
- Prepared a resume with a Umich email address

It will then ask if you are interested in an Employment Based Placement That answer will determine which version of the field application you complete

Every effort will be made to match you with a selected or similar agency that aligns with your pathway and goals. Please note this is a dynamic and constantly shifting process.



Non Employment Based Placement Applications

This will be the vast majority of you

- You will be asked to rank and describe your first and second priorities (weekly schedule, setting, and practice opportunities). This will aid your placing field faculty in the process
- Next, you will need to rank your top 3 choices based on the available agencies
 - Filters are available if helpful: Transportation, Stipend, Program Details, and Location.
 - We recommend you be as open as possible and limit your filter selections so you can review agencies you may not have typically considered
- If you do not see any agencies within 60 miles of your current residence, there is a button to click under the "Filter by Location" section



Employment Based Placements (EBP)

- Some may wish to explore whether your current employment can also serve as your field placement
- You will be required to view our EBP Webinar and attest
- You can search your current employer. If it is not listed, you will be able to list details
- There are multiple requirements and a separate application is required
- Major requirements include: (full details are available in the EBP application)
 - your proposed employment based placement can meet your planned pathway and CSWE competencies
 - your agency is willing to pursue the approval process
 - your agency is willing to support the number of field hours required
 - your agency has a MSW on staff who meets current field instructor requirements

The Employment based placements process begins with the same process of applying via the field application



Placing Process Considerations

Agency

- Field instructor/Agency availability
- Training program cycle
- Changes in funding
- Previous experience with students

Student

- Program schedule
- Student availability
- Student's interest/pathway
- Related experience
- Professionalism

Please do not reach out to agencies directly. Our office maintains relationships with our contracted agencies and it is important for us to maintain our established communication channels and expectations. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.



What Happens After you Apply

*Please check your umich email regularly and ensure timely responses

Application review by UM Field Faculty connected to your first choice	Resume / Goal Statement Sent to Agency	Interview Offer or Decline	Placement Offer or Decline
Field Faculty may reach out with questions or suggestions based on the agencies you ranked.	Materials are sent to the highest ranked agency you selected that is still accepting students. Additional Considerations




<u>What if I Don't Get an Interview or</u> <u>Am Not Accepted After I Interview?</u>

- <u>You are not guaranteed one of your ranked choices.</u> It is a guide to understand your preferences but is dependent on multiple factors
- Reach out to your field faculty to discuss your situation and circumstance
- Your assigned field faculty can provide any feedback received and offer support to improve your interview skills
- You may need to reflect on where you are in your skill development and what placements might be a better fit
- Field faculty work as a team. We will work together to find the next opportunity for you.
- Students who are unsuccessful or refuse two interview attempts will meet with their placing Field Faculty and the Field Director (or Assistant Director).



Field Placement Proximity

- "Local" options are within 45-60 min of the main Ann Arbor campus. (Most are in Ann Arbor, Ypsilanti, and Detroit)
- <u>Most</u> students travel an average of 30 to 60 minutes one way to get to field. **Please plan accordingly**
 - You are responsible for your transportation to your field site
 - If you don't drive or have a car, indicate this on your application, as this does limit options
 - Transportation options can include carpooling and public transportation

Once Placed - Preparing for Field



Congratulations on your placement!

- Review the content on the <u>Prepare to Start website</u>
- Read: <u>Are You a Joy?</u>
- Check in with the field instructor before the start date about any additional requirements you'll need to complete *Examples*
 - Health screenings & drug testing
 - Background checks
- Make sure you are checking and responding to emails from your umich account throughout the winter to ensure timely communication
- You will receive an email regarding your mandatory Pre-Field Orientation which will occur at the beginning of the Spring/Summer semester





Best Approaches to Field: 5 Pieces of Advice

- Be patient with all you have to learn
- Own your learning and manage your expectations. You learn just as much from what doesn't go well as what does.
- Learn to function with discomfort, anxiety, and ambiguity
- Be willing to make mistakes and learn from them
- Want, seek and use feedback





Final Thoughts

- Please don't hesitate to reach out to your assigned SSW Field Faculty with any questions or concerns.
- Friendly reminder your field placement ensures you obtain the necessary experiential practicum hours that align with accreditation standards and ensures you meet the requirements of the MSW degree.
- Barring any extenuating circumstances, we strongly encourage you to remain in your one field placement. Changing placements is disruptive to your learning experience and often delays your anticipated graduation plan and may have financial implications.

School Social Work Specialization Course Requirements

- Interpersonal Practice or Welfare of Children and Families Pathway *
 - SW 626 School Social Work Assessments
 - SW 628 School Social Work Interventions
 - SW515/SW691: 500 Field Hours of direct service with children and youth.

*Exceptions can be made for students in the Community Change pathway and the Global pathway, if the field placement can accommodate 500 hours of direct practice with children and youth, and a meeting is held with Beth Sherman to formulate a specific plan.
