



## **Clarice Ullman Freud Fellowships 2024**

### **I. Purpose**

The Clarice Ullman Freud Fellowships and the Clarice Ullman Freud Individual Research Fellowship were made possible by a gift from the estate of Clarice Ullman Freud, along with matching funds from the Ann and Robert Lurie Family Foundation. Professor Freud was the Director of Field Education while at the U-M School of Social Work.

The 2024 Freud Fellows will support the ongoing work of the Office of Field Education (OFE) with a heavy emphasis on integrating equity-based teaching practices in all elements of the field experience. This will include developing new field instructor training that can be offered in person, online, and asynchronously. Determination of awards is based on an evaluation of previous academic work, writing skills, recommendations, and other professional experiences, including human services experience (paid or volunteer) and the applicant's written supplementary statement. Applicants will also go through an interview with the OFE Team.

### **II. Freud Fellowship Award & Requirements**

A total of three Freud Fellowships will be awarded. The award amount for this Fellowship is \$6,000 per term for two terms (either Winter 2024 and Spring/Summer 2024, or Winter 2024 and Fall 2024). Students should plan to dedicate 10 hours per week to the Office of Field Education and the projects of the Freud Fellows.

### **III. Eligibility**

- Graduate students in good academic standing at the School of Social Work
- Freud Fellows must be enrolled in Foundation (SW515) or Advanced (SW691) field instruction during the fellowship's terms.
- Students must commit to the requirements of the Freud Fellowship during each term of the award.
- Demonstrate excellent communication, time management, collaboration, and strong writing skills.

  - Clarice Ullman Freud had a passion for serving children and families. Please write a one-page statement about how you see your chosen pathway will support the well-being of children and families.

The reference can be from a current or past professor or field instructor. Students may not utilize MSW program application recommendations.

### **V. Review Process**

The University of Michigan School of Social Work Office of Field Education Team will review all applications and related materials submitted by the application deadline and will select interview candidates. The application, review, interview, and selection process for the Freud Fellowship will take place in Fall 2023.
