



The Gus Harrison Scholarship in Social Work and Public Administration

I. Purpose

This scholarship was established by Dr. John R. Koza in honor of Gus Harrison. It is awarded to a student in social work or public administration who exemplifies the dedication to public service and integrity that has been illustrated by Gus Harrison's service to the State of Michigan Department of Corrections and the Michigan State Lottery.

II. Form of Support

The number of awards available varies each year and typically ranges between \$2,000 to \$13,000 for MSW students.

III. Eligibility

Eligible applicants are full-time students with an active status in the MSW Program who have a commitment to social work and public administration and demonstrated financial need.

IV. Application Materials

The following application materials are required:

- 1) Application coversheet
- 2) A two-page statement, double-spaced, describing the applicant's dedication to public service in social work and public administration
- 3) Resume

V. Review Process

The School's MSW Financial Aid Committee will evaluate the application materials. The Committee will assess each applicant's commitment to social work and public administration and financial need.

The review and selection for the Gus Harrison Scholarship in Social Work and Public Administration will take place in December 2020.
