Federal Funding

(Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid-FAFSA)

Direct Unsubsidized Loan

-\$20,500 per academic year (Fall/Winter)

-\$10,250 per semester (minus loan origination fee)

-Students enrolled in the Spring/Summer semester are eligible for an unsubsidized loan

•Unsubsidized loan to be awarded once registration occurs for Spring/Summer semester

-Interest rate is currently 5.28% (fixed over the life of the loan). Student is responsible for interest that accrues from the time the funds are disbursed. Interest rate may increase for loans in future academic years

-Loan Origination Fee (currently 1.059%)

Federal Funding

(Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid-FAFSA)

Direct Graduate Plus Loan

-Separate application required (studentaid.gov)

-Based upon a credit check

- -Maximum amount a student can borrow is the cost of attendance (determined by the University) minus any other financial aid received (includes scholarships/grants, loans, work-study)
- -Students enrolled in the Spring/Summer semester are eligible for an unsubsidized loan (a new application is required and is available in April each year)
 - -Interest rate is 6.28% (fixed over the life of the loan). Student is responsible for interest that accrues from the time the funds are disbursed. Interest rate may increase for loans in future academic years

-Loan origination fee (currently 4.228%)

Federal Funding

(Must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid-FAFSA)

Work Study

-Allows students to earn a paycheck (usually biweekly) for educational expenses and incidentals

-This award is **NOT** applied towards a student's account but is earned by working

-\$3,000 maximum per academic year (Fall/Winter)

-\$1,500 per semester is the normal allocation (ex: \$15/hour job=100 hours/semester)

-Many students work between 10-20 hours per week

-Work-study may be limited in Spring/Summer semester

Next Steps

-Verify residency status (if necessary, complete an Application for In-State Tuition as soon as possible; 10-12 week processing time)

- Accept/Decline loans and work-study awards in Wolverine Access
- •Please be mindful of the amounts you accept. You may be eligible for \$18,000 in graduate plus loans but do you really need the full amount to cover all expenses?


