What is the MasterTrack Certificate?

- Graduate level certificate on Coursera
 - Launched in 2020 (formally on edX)
 - Series of 5 classes plus MOOC
 - Foundation graduate level social work courses
 - Stand alone
 - Career development
- OR
- 1st step to UM-MSW

About the MasterTrack

- Cost: \$2,000
 - one full payment
 - 4 month payment plan
- 4-6 months to complete
- Asynchronous courses with two optional live sessions

MasterTrack Certificate Courses

The MTC consists of **1 MOOC** and **5 courses**:

- SWMT 101: Social Work Practice: Advocating for Social Justice & Change (MOOC)
- SWMT 505: Engaging Social Justice, Diversity and Oppression in Social Work
- SWMT 506: Essentials of Interpersonal Practice
- SWMT 507: Research Basics for Social Work practice
- SWMT 508: Essentials of Social Welfare Policy
- SWMT 509: Essentials of Community and Organizational Practice

Major Topics

- Social work code of ethics and core mission
- Crime and policing in communities
- Environmental Justice
- How to identify potential solutions to poverty and growing inequality
- The importance of social welfare policy for social workers
- Using evidence-informed practices and interventions to promote positive change
- Ethics, diversity and inclusion in social work
- Leading communities and organizations through ethical and responsible engagement
- Application of research to practice

MasterTrack Certificate

Course Structure

4-6 month program

- 1 MOOC (4 weeks)
 - Totally asynchronous
 - Brief interactive activities
 - No assignments
 - Quizzes
- 5 Courses (8 weeks each)
 - Mostly asynchronous
 - 1 synchronous meeting at the beginning (orientation to course, community building)
 - 1 synchronous office hour (about mid-point)
 - Assignments and activities (applied/practice based)
 - Quizzes

Curriculum Schedules For MasterTrack Students

- **Full Time On-Campus**
 - 3 semesters
- **Part Time On-Campus**
(Day or Evening)
 - 7 semesters
- **Full Time Online**
 - 3 semesters
- **Part Time Online**
 - 7 semesters



MSW Program Requirements

- 45 credits of total coursework
 - 31 academic credits
 - 14 field credits
 - 912 hours of field practice
 - Could be remote or employment-based in the U.S.

MSW Pathway Options

- Global Social Work Practice
- **Interpersonal Practice in Integrated Health, Mental Health, and Substance Abuse (option for online)**
- Management and Leadership
- Policy and Political Social Work
- Program Evaluation and Applied Research
- Social Work Practice with Older Adults and Families from a Lifespan Perspective
- Welfare of Children and Families

MasterTrack MSW Application Process

Step 1: Experience Review for MasterTrack MSW Program

- Significant post-bachelors human service-related experience required
- Complete the **Eligibility Review Form** and upload a copy of your resume to be submitted to OSS: <https://ssw.umich.edu/assets/msw-eligibility/>

Step 2: Apply to MSW Program

- After experience is reviewed and approved, complete MSW program application:

MSW Program Criteria for Admission

- Academics
 - Transcripts & Recommendations
- Recommendations
 - 2 (Academic/Professional)
- Supplementary Statement
 - 3 Page Statement
- Human Services/SW Experience
 - Resume & Application
- Personal Characteristics
 - Application, Recommendations, Statement, Resume

When to Apply to the MSW Program?

Online Program

- Winter 2023 Application
 - Final Deadline: December 1, 2022
- Spring 2023 Application
 - Final Deadline: April 1, 2023
- Fall 2023 Application
 - Early Deadline: December 1, 2022
 - Priority Deadline: March 1, 2023
 - Final Deadline: August 1, 2023

Financial Aid for MSW Courses

- No financial aid for MasterTrack courses. Payment plans may be available through Coursera
- Approximately **75%** of MSW students receive some form of grant and/or scholarship assistance from the School of Social Work

 - Need & merit-based grants & scholarships
 - **Need-based scholarships for part-time online students and tuition offsets.**
- Special Program Applications (**Full-time, On-Campus only**)
 - Child Welfare Scholarship, Community-Based Initiative, Geriatric Scholarship, Global Activities Scholarship Program, Integrated Health with Medically Underserved Populations Scholarship, Jewish Communal Leadership Program, National Community Scholars, New Leaders in African-Centered Social Work Program
