Question

I wanted to apply for the joint MSW/Doctorate program but missed the deadline for the 2019 doctoral program. Can I still start the MSW program this fall and apply for the 2020 social science doctorate as a joint program? If we have been placed on a waitlist for an specialized

If we have been placed on a waitlist for an specialized program, are we still allowed to apply for other programs?

How many people are chosen to do their field placements abroad?

How many students per country are admitted to the global scholars program?

If we don't start aplying for global field placements until our first semester, do we still start a local field placement in the fall even though we won't know if we got it until after the semester begins? Or is everyone allowed to do a global field placement?

Do you recomend doing anything other than the required essay for the global scholars program if I am extremely interested?

If I plan on commuting, is there something I should do prior to have better chances of having classes on the least amount of days?

Is there a deadline to hear back from Special Programs regarding decisions on programs we've applied to?

I heard something earlier about scholarship applications being due on April 1st -- Which scholarship specifically does this due date correspond to?

I applied for the Joint PhD-MSW Program at UMich and was only accepted into the MSW program. Would it be possible to enter the Joint-PhD program at a later date after starting the MSW program?

Answer

Yes. You will need to apply to this program by December 1, 2019.

Yes, you are more than welcome to apply for any special program that is still accepting applications.

About 10-12 students. Students in the Global Activities Scholarship program and a few additional student will complete global field placements. There are many other global options: https://ssw.umich.edu/offices/global-

About 6 - 8 students are accepted and there is no quota per country.

If you do not get accepted to complete a global placment, you would stay in the local placement for your time in the program. While most students are able to do a global placement, not all students will actually complete one

Depending on your registration date, you m.ay need to petition for closed courses in order to have most of your classes on the same day. I strongly recommend backpacking courses at the appropriate time and being available during your registration date/time for the best chances.

Decisions are emailed out at the earliest date possible.

This deadline applies to our special scholarship programs.

Yes, you could re-apply to the PhD program for Fall 2020. The deadline is December 1, 2019.

How is tuition cost affected by choosing different length tracks?

Once you have already applied to the MSW program can you still send in applications to the special programs?

We will get emails from you about the deadline for field placement right? What is the final deadline?

Where do we find the list of approved field sites? I've already been accepted so I should have access right?

How many students will be accepted for the Fall 2019 in the SSW?

How competitive is it to get accepted to live in Munger?

Are students who are enrolled or the Fall 2019 MSW program allowed to defer for a year? Who should they speak to if considering this?

How is social work different from psychology in a school setting working with children?

What does the Michigan School of Social Work do to help students get jobs after students complete the MSW program?

Answer

Tuition costs are different each academic year (each academic year begins in the Fall). If you are 12 month, you will pay 3 semesters of the same tuition, 16 month-3 semesters of the same tuition and 1 semester of a different rate, and the 20 month has 2 semesters of the same tuition and 2 semesters of a different rate.

Yes. May 16th for students beginning field in Fall 2019.

We expect an incoming MSW class of approximately 430.

Munger Residence Hall does fill up each year. It's good to apply as soon as possible.

Yes. If you want to defer you can send a request via emai to: ssw.msw.info@umich.edu with a brief explanation as to why you are requesting a deferment.

Psychologists are often completing assessments for different diagnoses, whereas social works are often identifying barriers to learning and are involved in advocacy, resource connection, group support for students in school settings.

Our Career Services Office offers resume/cover letter reviews, mock interviews, and workshops on salary negotiation. We also maintain a job bulletin that is emailed out to students every two weeks.

How can I gain quantitative/qualitative social work research experience in this program? How does one join a lab?

Are MSW students permitted to enoll in SW 790 seminar courses or are those reserved for Phd students?

If we have not yet been accepted into the SSW, when is the latest we should expect an email?

If I paid the admission deposit last year and then had to defer my admission to start this Fall do I need to make another deposit this year?

Answer

Hello. Students are able to engage in an independent study which allows you to work with a faculty member to design your own research project for course credit. You are also able to search studentemployment.umich.edu which may list some research related jobs. You are also are able to contact faculty members directly for opportunities to engage in research that they may be conducting. Some students use their work-study award to gain additional

Hello. MSW students are able to enroll in PhD level courses. Some may require special permission and/or prerequisites for the MSW student. More information can be provided once the course schedule is released. Doctoral courses are 800 level courses. The SW 790 courses are mini courses that are available to MSW students.

It is not common to get expempt from 504. However, you are welcome to file for an exemption. Many BSW students do receive exemptions from 560 if they have covered the content of the course in their BSW program.

Yes, you can utilize your electives in various departments across campus as long as they are graduate level.

It depends on when you submitted your FAFSA (to UM). Please contact us at ssw.msw.info@umich.edu and we can look into this for you.

Decisions are emailed out at the earliest date possible. Depending on your initial decision, an applicant may not know whether they have been admitted or not until sometimes a week or so before the Fall semester begins. If you are placed on our alternate list, we maintain that throughout the summer. A final decision will come at the end of August. We will review your application for an initial decision shortly after your application submission. It can be a month or longer before you receive an initial decision

No, your enrollment deposit will be moved to this fall.

Are there certain requirements that the school reviews if you are considering deferment?

Can you share how I can learn more about applying to be a resident assistant as a graduate student?

If you're already enrolled or begin with your program either 16 or 20 month program, but you're interested in applying for the international volunteer program midprogram, can you do this?

It was mentioned earlier that for the 20 month program, students take 15 credits per semetser. How often do students meet on campus for class in this 20-month program?

If you have been in the field for several years, and have had supervision for that amount of time, that wouldn't carry over for the 912 hours that is expected for field hours, correct?

If we have already received a letter from the office of financial aid, is there a chance we might still receive additional aid later on or is this a final amount?

If I recieved some financial aid as work study, does that mean I will have to work while I am in the advanced standing program? If so, where and how do I find the necessary employment?

Is there a specific date by which March 1st deadline applicants will hear back?

Answer

We accept requests to defer up to two years. If you wish to defer, please email us your request at ssw.msw.info@umich.edu. Be sure to include the reason for your wish to defer.

Typically, Peace Corps applications are submitted by September 1st of the fall term when students begin course work.

Most courses can be scheduled over the course of 2-3 days per week as you will be in field placement at 2 days a week

Correct. We cannot give any field credit for work completed before you began the MSW program.

Ususally Dual degree students with MPH/MSW start taking MPH courses in their first year and complete the program over 6 semesters.

If we are employed in a place that has licensed clinical social workers in supervisory roles, and the employer is interested in applying to be a potential field placement, would it be possible to complete one of our field placements at a current employer? If the field placement role was different from our regular job duties?

Will applicants who applied by the March 1st priority deadline receive their acceptance letters before those who have not?

Is it possible to pursue a dual degree as well as a scholarship program?

How much impact does one's elective course decision have on their future professional employment?

I don't have a GPA to be in advanced standing but I have my BSW degree. How can I do part time MSW program?

Does the 20 month program require 3 classes each semester?

Answer

Yes please email ssw.msw.info@umich.edu with a request and the date that you would like it to be extended too.

Yes, you are more than welcome to participate in the webinar.

Yes you have access. The number of sessions are determined by the therapist based upon the needs of the student.

Possibly, please contact the office of field instruction for how that agency can work to become an approved placement. You will need to have a different supervisor and tasks from your regular position.

We use a modified rolling process. Once an application is complete, it is sent to the review committee. Admissions decisions are sent at the earliest date possible.

The only dual degree in which you cannot also pursue a special program is MSW/MPH

Employer's number one question they love to answer is - Is this applicant a great fit for the job? Can they perform the tasks or have the ability to do so? So it's the overall class knowledge and field experience that is key - not just your electives. Sometimes, if your required classes and field gives you the background needed for employment - utilize electives to take something different say in another unit on campus or a doctoral level course because you may not get a chance to do so after graduation.

Upon admission, I recommend meeting with Tim Colenback or Erin Zimmer to schedule a plan.

You will be enrolled in 15-16 credits a semester. This usually includes 4 classes and 2 days of field placement.

Question	Answer
Can I do part time in MSW under extended degree?	I recommend meeting with Tim Colenback or Erin Zimmer to set up a plan.
Since I have a BSW but not a 3.5 gpa. Do I have to do 900 field placement?	You may be exempt from foundation field which would only require 684 hours. You will be able to apply from foundation courses/field exemptions this summer.
When should we apply for specialization certifications?	The specializations do not require an application rather you should work with your advisor to ensure that the course requirements and field requirements are being met. Some of the specilizations may require an application shortly before graduation to make sure all you receive all applicable documentation upon graduating.
Is a research thesis required for graduation?	No. But if you would like to you can do an independent study with a professor.
Can you have the Management of Human Services practice method as a New Leaders in African-Centered Social Work scholar? I'm contemplating changing my practice method.	Yes, the New Leaders Program allows for any practice method/area.
What is the process for joining/running for a position in the school of social work student union?	During your time there will be an election held and you would have to be nominated to run and then students or your fellow peers will vote you in :),I highly recommend this! I did this during my time here and it was a great experience in advocating for my peers.
So there is no formal orientation. Did I hear that correctly?	We will have Fall SEED Orientation activities August 27 - 30. All students are strongly encouraged to attend.
Is there a possibility to switch from 16 to 20 month enrollment?	Yes, if you would like to request a change, please email your request to us at ssw.msw.info@umich.edu at the earliest date possible. Be sure to include a brief reason for your wish to change.

What is the difference between the 16 month and 20 month enrollment?

Is all field work unpaid?

If financial aid is not enough to cover fees for 16 months could we switch to 20 months/extra term option to help with that?

Can we/should we apply for all the integrated health programs if our interest is in that focus?

What is the latest date we will receive notification of whether we are or are not accepted into the special programs we've applied for?

For the 16th month program, the first semester is only classes? if so, how often do classes meet?

Answer

16 month schedule has four semesters/terms (Fall, Winter, SP/Summer and Fall). So those in the 16 month schedule complete the program in 16 months starting in Sept and graduating in Dec. Also those on the 16 - month schedule have one block field placement starting in January and ending in December - no field the first semester. Generally, the 20 month schedule is four terms over two years (Fall, Winter, Fall, Winter) Students on the 20 month track will have the summer semester off. However, those on this schedule can have two different field placements for each year.

Most field placements do not have funds to pay students, however, some do have stipends. The school does offer assistance if students are traveling a long distance to field. You can talk with your field faculty member when setting up field

You should schedule a time to talk with Cerise Carrington to discuss financial aid options. Both programs are essentially the same cost.

I noticed that I can't appy for several scholarships until August. Are these scholarships for the 2019-20 or 2020-21 academic year?

Are there options for housing employment which includes free housing?

Answer

Most students average 15 credits per semester. This usually included 4-5 courses along with field in the semesters that you have field placement scheduled

The MSW program may be able to assist students with a portion of the travel and housing costs while abroad. Students can apply for scholarships to help with some of these expenses during the first term in the program.

Hi there! Yes! You are also welcome to take classes that are offered in the special programs just please note that you may need to petition into these courses as priority is given to students in the special programs.

Advanced standing is Fall, Winter and Summer/spring. 16 Month is Fall, Winter, Spring/summer and another semester of Fall.

There is graduate housing for families. Please feel free to visit housing.umich.edu for more information

You will typically to to field placement 2 days/week and attend classes over 2-3 days.

We are still admiting students for fall 2019, but we will likely have about 130 advanced standing students.

Yes, you can apply for a GSI or GSSA position in another unit. You can view listings at careers.umich.edu

Some of our donor scholarships require application materials (resume and essay, etc) and review by faculty. Students have to submit application materials to be considered for those scholorships that's why they are offered in the fall (2019 - 2020) for students enrolled in the program.

Generally the only option to receive free housing would be to apply to become a Resident Assistant. There are also a few scholarhip type programs that may offer free housing (Telluride program, etc).

I have been admitted but I am a bit worried that after being out of school for a few years that I may sturggle with the course load or acdemic assignments. I was wondering if there is anyway to fully prepare or perhaps are the professors and a writing assistance avalible while in the program? Just support I guess.

I would recommend that you focus on Interpersonal Practice and Mental Health.

Dr. Kattari teaches in this area so you could likely take course with her and/or create indepdent study courses to go more in depth in this area. The school offers a post MSW sex therapy certificate as well.

Minors can be done within your 16 or 20 month programs. You use electives to fulfill them.

Generally no. Students will only have 9 credits of electives while in the program and most specializations or certificates require 6-9 credits. There are also field placement implications for many of those as well

To obtain a LMSW in Michigan, one must complete 4000 hours of post MSW work expereince, 100 hours of supervision and pass the ASWB Clinical Exam. Post MSW experience and supervision are often obtained in a graduate's place of employment and clinical work is very broad (case managment, therapy, education of client, etc). Supervision not provided (the exception) has to be purchased and arranged by the graduate.

As long as it is an approved site, I would recommend making sure that your field application materials align with that agency but you must also interview and be selected by the agency.

Yes. To get help on papers we have a writing center in the Office of Student Services. Betsy Williams is the Writing Coordinator.

There are not classes and field placement for the spring/summer term.

No, as long as you are a full-time student, it does not cost extra to add a minor. A minor can be incorporated into the 45 or 60 credit program.

Both field placements are focused on your practice method and area. The first term is foundation field. All additional terms are advanced field instruction.

Yes, absolutely. Please email us at ssw.msw.info@umich.edu with your request prior to beginning the program

Yes! Michigan Medicine has field placement options for many other students. Tune into the field placement webinar on April 17 at 5pm for more details on the field placement process.

Both programs are 4 months so the cost is very similar. Typically students do not make their determination based upon cost.

Answer

Our fall 2019 MSW application will close on August 1, 2019; however, if you are interested in fall 2019, I strongly encourage you to apply at the earliest date possible.

Recommendation letters are very important however, we closely consider all required application materials.

I do not believe we are working with the UN. I recommend checking in with Katie Lopez and if not, see which placements can provide similar training.

You would need to contact the School of Public Health regarding your MPH application. If you are admitted to MPH, then you would be a dual MSW/MPH. If you are not admitted to MPH, then you would be an MSW student.

We use a modified rolling process. Decisions are emailed at the earliest date possible.

Your due date for enrollment deposit and confirming your spot in the program was included in the letter of acceptance. If you need to check, please contact our office at 734-936-0961.

It varies - CBT, Motivational Interviewing, DBT, etc.

Variations depend upon the field placement setting and/or training/research focus of faculty teaching the course.

The MSW program offers some coursework specific to various modalities, not specific to psychodynamic therapy. I have yet to be accepted, but have other MSW programs offers. Is there a date when all decisions will be made by?

Answer

There are no public transportation options available from Ann Arbor to the Detroit area (or at least available options require a long travel time) therefore not having a vehicle does limit your choices for being able to successfully engage in placements in the Detroit area. Not having a vehicle does not limit quality of life as there are several experiences within the Ann Arbor area. There is a connector bus that goes from campus to our Detroit Center location during the day, therefore you are able to experience our larger metro area.

You are more than welcome to contact the Office of Field Instruction but many of our students are placed in the metro Detroit area as it is the largest area within a 40 min driving distance to service marginalized populations.

Answer

We recommend that because our program is full time that students work no more than 20 hours a week. Jobs will require flexibility as classes and field primarily take place during the day and during the week.
