**Position** Assistant Professor

**Position Description** Teach courses at the graduate or undergraduate level, especially in the areas of generalist and/or advanced social work practice, or human behavior and the social environment. Conduct an active program of research and publication, including participation in seeking external funding to support research. Carry an advising load of graduate or undergraduate students and participate in curriculum maintenance, development, and assessment. Engage in service to the school, college, university, profession, or community.

**Minimum Qualifications** Applicants must have a doctorate in social work or related field, an M.S.W., and at least two years post-M.S.W. practice experience if interested in teaching social work practice. Candidates must show prior teaching experience or other evidence of teaching ability and effectiveness. Candidates should have a defined research agenda and publication record commensurate with experience.

**Preferred Qualifications** A program of research in one of the areas that the school has identified for special emphasis and with possibilities for collaboration (e.g., intervention efficacy, trauma, organization and delivery of mental health services, veteran's health and mental health, animal-assisted interventions). Experience seeking or participating in externally funded research research.
