The University of Texas at Arlington School of Social Work invites nominations and applications for multiple Assistant Professor Tenure-Track and Associate Professor Tenured positions effective Fall semester 2018.

We are especially interested in adding faculty who will strengthen our capacity in the areas of Health, Aging, and Mental Health with a special emphasis on diversity and interdisciplinary research activities. Additionally, we support the UTA Strategic Plan and its Health and Human Condition theme (see <http://www.uta.edu/strategicplan/plan/themes/health.php>).

Minimum requirements for the **Assistant Professor** positions are:

- Ph.D. in social work or a related field (ABD considered)
- A record of publication in recognized refereed academic journals
- Evidence of a commitment to interdisciplinary research
- Plan for obtaining external funding

Preferences include:

- Masters of Social Work (MSW) Degree
- Two years of post-MSW practice experience
- Teaching experience, with the ability to teach in our Health, Aging and Mental Health tracks
- Ability and interest in teaching online courses

Minimum requirements for the **Associate Professor** positions are:

- Earned Ph.D. in Social Work or related field
- Eligibility for a tenured appointment at the rank of Associate Professor
- Established program of research, with a progressive track record of external funding
- A record of successfully managing funded research projects
- A strong record of scholarly journal publications

Preferences include:

- Established program of research with significant federal funding
- A strong record of participating in interdisciplinary research work

The University of Texas at Arlington is a Carnegie Research-1 “highest research activity” institution. With a projected global enrollment of close to 58,000, UTA is one of the largest institutions in the state of Texas. Guided by its Strategic Plan *Bold Solutions / Global Impact*, UTA fosters interdisciplinary research and teaching to enable the sustainable megacity of the future within four broad themes: health and the human condition, sustainable urban communities, global environmental impact, and data-driven discovery. UTA was cited by *U.S. News & World Report* as having the second lowest average student debt among U.S. universities. *U.S. News & World Report* also ranks UTA fifth in the nation for undergraduate diversity. The University is a Hispanic-Serving Institution and is ranked as the top four-year college in Texas for veterans on *Military Times’* 2017 Best for Vets list.

The School of Social Work is one of the largest in the country, with more than 2,200 students enrolled in the BSW, MSW, and Ph.D. programs. The School is home to the Center for Addiction and Recovery Studies, the Judith Birmingham Center for Child Welfare, and the Center for Clinical Social Work, as well as serving as host for the University’s Diversity Studies Minor. It is also home to three professional journals: *The Journal of Technology and Human Services*, *The Journal of Policy Practice*, and *Adoption Quarterly*.
